# Innov8 Awards Step-by-Step Guide

## What are the Innov8 Awards?

*The Innov8 Awards recognize excellence in research, innovation, and change-making ideas presented by current students or alumni of any program or department at Georgian College.*

There are a total of six awards available!

## What do the winners of the Innov8 Awards receive?

All applicants accepted into the Innov8 Awards Showcase will receive an Innov8 Award participation certificate.

The six (6) winners and/or winning teams will receive the following:

- ◆ Innov8 Awards achievement certificate (each individual)
- ◆ recognition on a student co-curricular record
- ◆ one (1) digital gift card totalling \$150 CAD (no cash value)
  - ➡ for winning teams, the digital gift card totalling \$150 CAD (no cash value) will be split equally between all members
  - ➡ digital gift cards will be emailed to the winners following **RISE 2021**

## Who is eligible to take part in the Innov8 Awards?

All entrants must be current students or alumni of any program or department at Georgian College.

## What type of work or research can be showcased as part of the Innov8 Awards?

We encourage everyone to submit a proposal for consideration!

Examples of possible submissions include:

- ◆ course-based work and/or projects
- ◆ research in-progress
- ◆ completed research
- ◆ anything that demonstrates your creativity, innovation, and/or change making ideas

## Are co-presenters allowed?

Yes! Enter individually or in teams with up to 4 co-presenters.

- ➔ for winning teams, the digital gift card totalling \$150 CAD (no cash value) will be split equally between all members

## How do I submit my entry for the Innov8 Awards?

Amazing! We're thrilled you are taking part. Applying online is a fast and easy process if you follow these steps:

### STEP 1: Proposal Submission

Click link to apply [www.GeorgianCollege.ca/RISE2021applications](http://www.GeorgianCollege.ca/RISE2021applications)

Have the following elements ready to include in your proposal:

- ◆ first name, last name and email address (including co-presenters, if applicable)
- ◆ program of study and student number (current students only)
- ◆ name of completed program/certificate/degree (alumni only)
- ◆ proposed title for your submission
- ◆ a short description of the work you are submitting
- ◆ three learning outcomes for attendees
  - ➔ what do you hope participants will learn?
  - ➔ for example, a learning outcome for a proposal on cybersecurity might be "participants will have a better understanding of cybersecurity threats and how to stay safe online"

- ◆ biography/profile
- ◆ relevant social media links (i.e., LinkedIn, course website, etc.)
- ◆ profile picture (headshot)

Make sure to follow the instructions on the screen and complete all required fields

- ➡ you won't be able to navigate to the previous screen or edit your application until you click submit proposal
- ➡ you will receive a confirmation email with a link to access your application
- ➡ you can edit and make changes to your application until the deadline **March 29, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. EST**

When prompted, select **Innov8 Awards Showcase**

Click **submit proposal**.

## What is the deadline to submit a proposal?

All proposals must be complete and submitted by **March 29, 2021 at 5:00 p.m. EST**

In fairness to all applicants, **no late entries will be accepted.**

## STEP 2: Proposal Review

Thank you for submitting your proposal for the first annual Innov8 Awards!

Our panel of judges will review all of the completed applications **submitted by the deadline.**

- ➔ each application will be independently reviewed by two (2) judges
- ➔ all applicants will be notified via email regarding the status of their application by **March 30, 2021**

## STEP 3: Review the Innov8 Awards Rubric

If your proposal is accepted, congratulations!

Now is a great time to review the **Innov8 Awards rubric, included on the final page of this document**, to see how our panel of judges will evaluate all of the submissions and determine the winners.





## STEP 4: Submit the Two (2) REQUIRED Showcase Elements

Complete and submit the two (2) required elements.

Make sure you've reviewed the rubric that our panel of judges will be using evaluate all of the entries to ensure that your submission meets all of the criteria (see **page 16**).

- ➡ incomplete submissions will not be considered for an Innov8 Award

### ◆ ELEMENT ONE (1): Pitch Video

This is a quick way to let all of the RISE2021 attendees get to know you and your work!

Your pitch video should include all of the following components:

- ➡ an introduction, including first and last name, program of study or completed program for all presenters
- ➡ the title of your project
- ➡ a brief explanation of your project

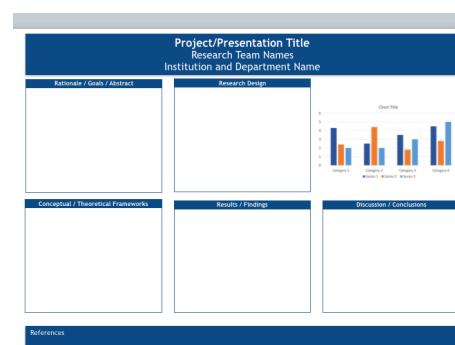
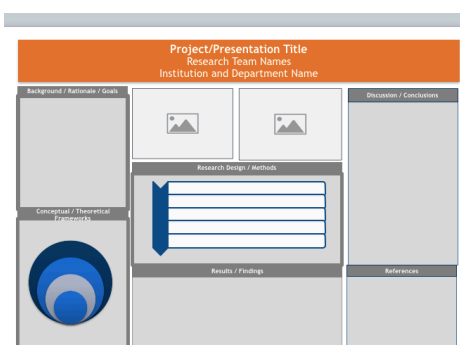
In order to upload and display your pitch video properly within the virtual platform, please follow these submission guidelines:

- ➡ one (1) MP4 video file, HD quality
- ➡ 16:9 aspect ratio, up to 90 MB **MAXIMUM**
- ➡ 1–2-minutes **MAXIMUM**
- ➡ do not include title slides or credits (**we will be adding an intro and exit slide to each pitch video**)

## ◆ ELEMENT TWO (2): Slide Deck

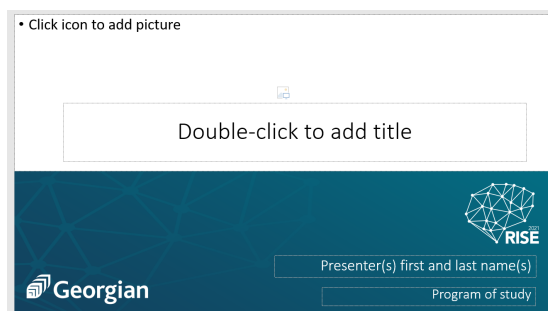

The slide deck replaces what would have been a poster at our previous live events (see poster format examples below). All of the components have been given one slide each in the deck. **Do not add additional slides.**

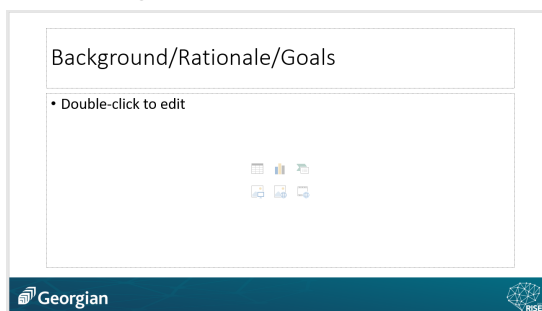

- ➡ please add a personal watermark and/or copywrite language to protect your intellectual property.
