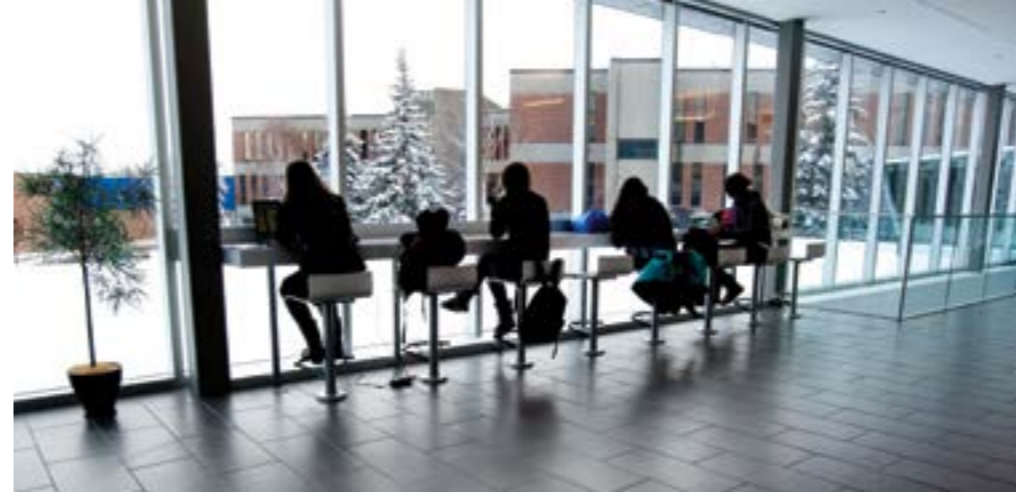

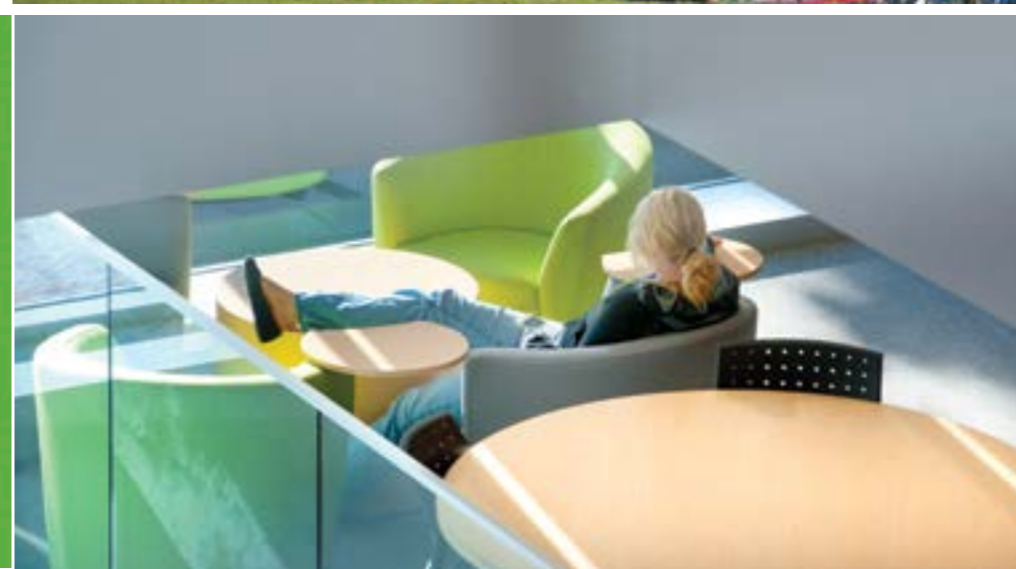

► HOMESTAY

The Georgian College International Homestay program provides exciting opportunities. Students can experience a Canadian lifestyle and establish relationships within the community. Our Homestay program provides safe, caring and interactive hosts with whom international students can improve their language skills and cultural awareness.

Homestay hosts provide necessary household items, including a furnished bedroom for the student. Most homes are located close to public transport or within walking distance of the campus.

► ACCOMMODATION

FULL HOMESTAY

The host provides a variety of nutritional, well-balanced meals (breakfast, lunch and dinner) every day – including weekends.

SHARED HOMESTAY

The student shares the kitchen with the Homestay host. The student buys, prepares and cleans up after his or her own meals. The Homestay host helps the student become familiar with the kitchen, explaining use of equipment as well as where to find grocery stores and cooking supplies.

PRIVATELY RUN ON-CAMPUS RESIDENCES

Our residences are managed by Campus Living Centres and offer everything you need to make your college experience fun and safe. Each one is different, but they all include private bedrooms with double beds, shared kitchens and bathrooms, as well as high-speed internet or Wi-Fi. Privately run on-campus residences are available at the Barrie, Orillia and Owen Sound campuses.

OFF-CAMPUS RESIDENCES (RENTALS)

Apartments are situated within five minutes walking distance of Georgian College. These four-storey residential buildings house 257 students and have been specifically designed to meet the needs of students attending Georgian College.

► ENGLISH LANGUAGE STUDIES

Cultural immersion in a higher education environment is a great way to improve your English language skills. The English for Academic Purposes (EAP) program at the Barrie Campus provides the necessary skills for students to succeed in postsecondary education, work and life in Canada. Georgian's eight-level program, accredited by Languages Canada, is available to international and domestic students alike.

Each level consists of seven weeks of classroom instruction. Our courses are designed to improve speaking, reading, writing, vocabulary and grammar skills, and include computer-assisted language learning skills. Students in Level 7 and 8 can take a college credit course. Students who pass Level 8 gain direct entry into postsecondary programs.

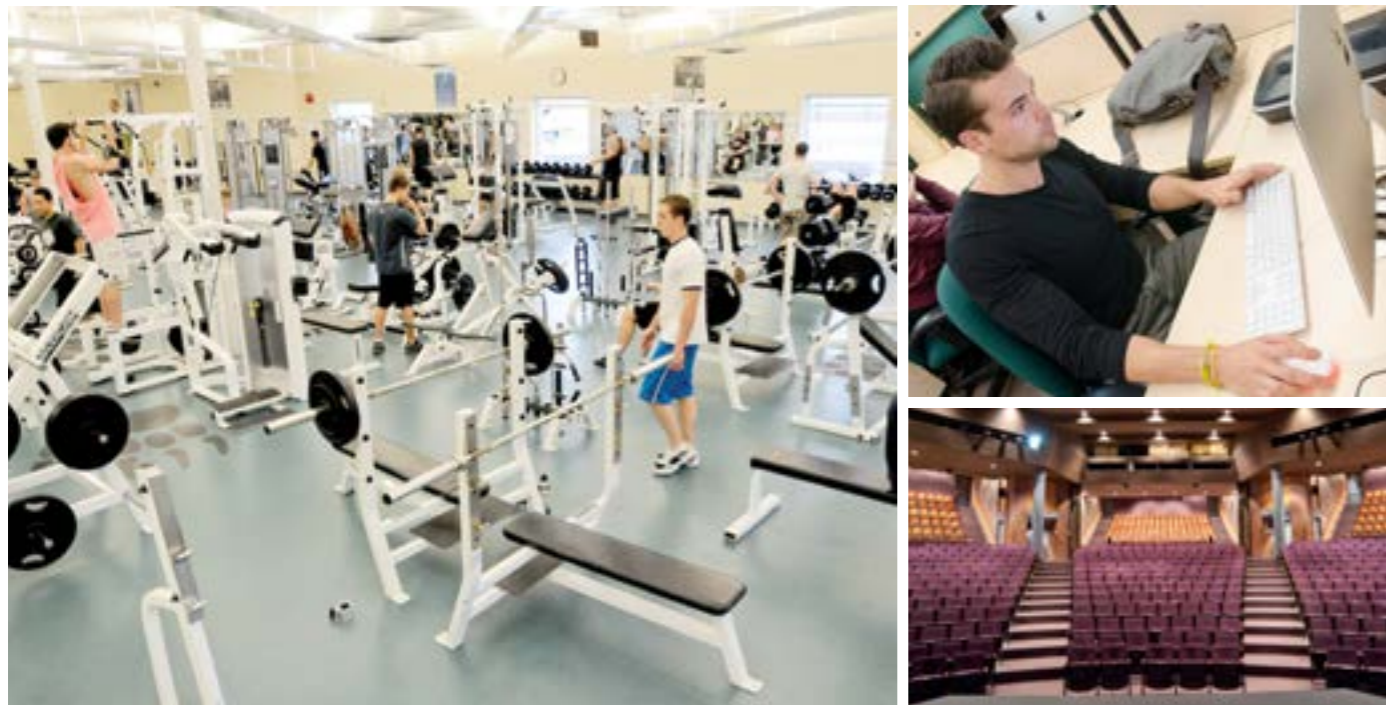

▶ WORK OPPORTUNITIES

YES! INTERNATIONAL STUDENTS CAN LEGALLY WORK IN CANADA

International students with a valid study permit enrolled in a co-op or internship program must apply for a work permit to be able to legally work off-campus during their terms. Since each work term may involve a different employer, the work permit will have conditions stating that Georgian College is the employer. Georgian decides where the student can legally work for the co-op or internship placement. This permit only allows students to work off-campus in positions related to their work term requirements. Students must have the co-op work permit before they can begin work. Students with a study permit for a program that leads to a degree, diploma or certificate, that is at least six months in duration will be allowed to work up to 20 hours per week.



▶ THE GEORGIAN COLLEGE ADVANTAGE

Most co-ops are full-time and paid; you can earn between \$6,000 and \$8,000 in each co-op semester.

Our international co-op team will assist in helping you develop your resumé and improving your interview skills for your job search.

In addition to opportunities for work during your studies, qualifying students holding a diploma from a program of two years or more can remain in Canada on a work permit for up to three years.

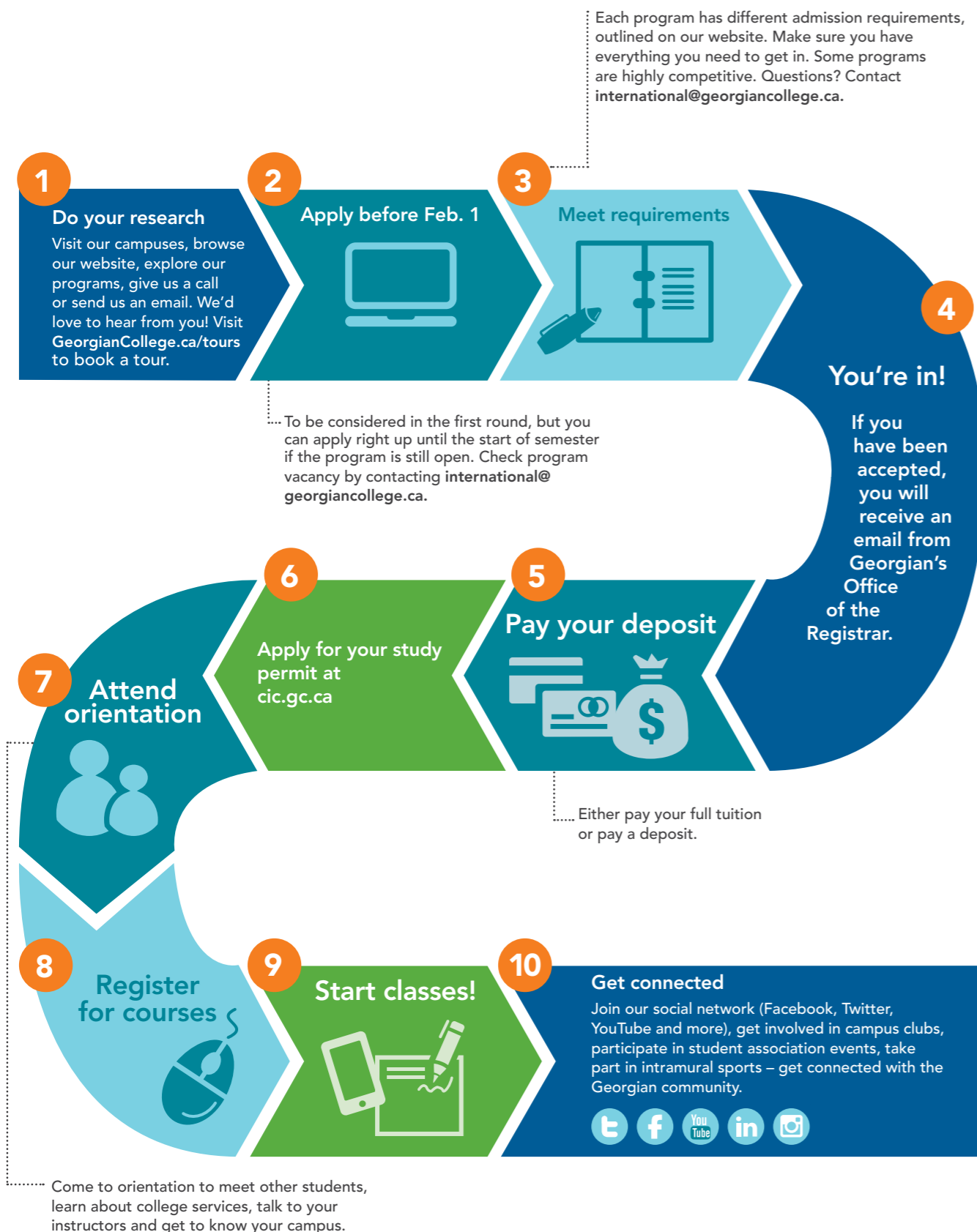

► BECOMING A GEORGIAN STUDENT



► APPLY TODAY

ADMISSION PROCESS:

1. APPLY

Apply, using our online application or complete the international student application (PDF) available at GeorgianCollege.ca.

- Applicants are urged to apply as early as possible to ensure there is sufficient time to obtain a student permit.
- Application deadlines: May 1 for September start, Oct. 1 for January start and March 1 for May start. After these dates, it's first come, first served. For highly competitive programs the equal consideration date is Feb. 1 for all intakes. Applications are accepted all year round if space is available.
- Please ensure that you include the \$100 CAD processing fee with your application. We are unable to process applications that do not include the processing fee.
- If it's over one year ago that you have applied to Georgian, you must complete a new application form and pay the \$100 processing fee. You do not need to submit academic documents. We will request additional documents, if required.

2. DOCUMENTATION

- Original or certified copies of English language test scores, academic records and any other translated documentation may be scanned and sent by email along with your application. High-resolution scans are required. Original or certified paper copies are not required unless requested as part of the admissions process.
- Students need to show proof of graduation, subjects taken and grades received.
- Students who are not graduating until later in the year should send current transcripts along with mid-term grades.

3. ACCEPTANCE

- Once we reach an admissions decision, you or your representative will receive an email with a letter of acceptance or a notice of refusal. Please note that all letters of acceptance are emailed with a PDF copy of the letter of acceptance. Students who receive a conditional acceptance are responsible for submitting the required documentation for a final acceptance to the program.

4. DEPOSIT

- Tuition fees for the first semester are due by June 15 for September start dates and Oct. 15 for January start dates to guarantee your place in the program.

5. STUDY PERMIT/VISA

- Once you have an acceptance letter and tuition receipt, you may apply for a student permit/student visa from the Canadian Embassy or consulate. Note: The application process could take between four to six months. Please notify us at reginternational@georgiancollege.ca as soon as you receive your study permit/student visa. Georgian College's designation learning institution number is **CIC DLI# O19395677361**.

► ADMISSION

REQUIREMENTS

FOR CERTIFICATE, DIPLOMA AND DEGREE PROGRAMS, WE REQUIRE:

- Secondary or high school transcripts with proof of graduation, subjects taken and grades received
- English and (for most programs) math at the Grade 12 level

FOR GRADUATE CERTIFICATE PROGRAMS, WE REQUIRE:

- College or university transcripts with proof of graduation, subjects taken and grades received

FOR ENGLISH LANGUAGE PROFICIENCY, WE REQUIRE:

- Must have completed three full years of study at the secondary school level in English in a country where English is a primary language (four years are required for BScN and Pharmacy Technician programs)
- Must have completed one full year of study in an accredited postsecondary program in English in a country where English is a primary language (not applicable to Pharmacy Technician program)
- Completion of level 8 (last 7 weeks) of Georgian's General Arts and Science – English for Academic Purposes program with a GPA of 70 per cent or higher for admission to Georgian's diploma and certificate programs; a GPA of 75 per cent or higher for admission into Georgian's degree programs; a GPA of 80 per cent or higher for admission into Georgian's graduate certificate programs (not applicable to BScN or Pharmacy Technician)
- Ontario Secondary School Diploma and English credit (Grade 12 U, M or C) issued by a public school board

- Applicants who do not meet any of the above criteria will be required to submit an acceptable English language proficiency test with the appropriate score (see Georgian International website for a list of acceptable language tests)
