What is GC Flex?

A GC Flex course means faculty deliver lectures and labs in the classroom and simultaneously online. You can choose to attend class:

- on campus, in person
- online at the same time (virtual class)
- online at your convenience – you choose when you want to watch the lectures (asynchronous)

Students wanting to study online asynchronously – PLEASE NOTE – because these courses are delivered in 3 different methods, the course you register into will show a day and time – if you choose to study asynchronously, you are not required to attend live classes, either virtually or on-campus.

How long will it take to complete the certificate?

This varies depending on how many courses you take each semester. Total courses: 12 plus 2 Field Placements

3 courses per semester in semester 1: finish in 6 semesters (2 years)
Fall-Winter-Summer-Fall-Winter-Summer

2 courses per semester: finish in 7 semesters or under 2.5 years
Fall-Winter-Summer-Fall -Winter-Summer-Fall

What is the cost of the program?

There is no program fee when studying part-time. As a part-time student, you can take 1, 2 or 3 courses at a time in any given semester. Payment is per course, as you register.

In addition, graduates are able to employ a number of more complex functions supporting organizational effectiveness including supporting the design of food and nutrition human resource plan, financial analysis and control, and collaborating in the preparation of an organization's business plan or client care plan.
